39 wanted persons in I. Norte arrested

As a result of INPPO’s quick response to the Chief PNP’s drive vs. WPs

CAMP JUAN, Laoag City-- The Philippine National Police under P/Gen. Rodolfo S. Azurin Jr., Chief PNP, has initiated a nationwide simultaneous campaign against Wanted Persons (WPs) on August 30, 2022 in sustaining the PNP’s Peace and Order Framework called M+K+K=K, particularly on the aspect of KAAYUSAN.

In line with this initiative, Ilocos Norte police provincial director P/Col. Julius C. Suriben led the Manang and Manong Pulis of Ilocos Norte Police Provincial Office in the massive manhunt against wanted persons in the province and to bring them to court and face justice.

As a result, the consolidated efforts of Team INPPO arrested 39 Wanted Persons including one Most Wanted Individual with a DILG cash reward accused of the crime of rape.

DA Region 1 rolls out distribution of veggies seeds to public schools

SAN FERNANDO CITY, La Union - The Department of Agriculture Regional Field Office 1 (DA RFO1) has rolled out the distribution of assorted vegetable seeds to public schools in the region under its Gulayan sa Paaralan Program (GPP).

Maricar Bongais, High-Value Crops Development Program (HVCDP)

coordinator of DA RFO1, said a total of P1.2 million was allotted for this year’s GPP for the 100 public elementary and high schools in the region.

Of the GPP recipients, 40 schools from Pangasinan received a fund allocation of P480,000.00 while 20 schools each from the provinces of La Union, Ilocos Sur, and Ilocos Norte received P240,000.00,

respectively.

Through the program, the DA RFO1 distributed assorted vegetable seeds such as tomato, eggplant, okra, ampalaya, squash, string beans, pechay, upo, and kangkong. Aside from vegetable seeds. Garden tools, crates, and wheelbarrows were likewise given.

Sugar, laptop cases: Iron-fist actions needed

Only a few weeks have passed since Ferdinand “Bongbong” Marcos took his oath as President, and yet two big scandals have already rocked the new administration.

The first is the mess arising from an attempt to import 300,000 metric tons of sugar. This was purportedly authorized by a resolution of the Sugar Regulatory Administration (SRA). It turned out, though, that President Marcos was not informed about the resolution despite the fact he is the chairman of SRA in his capacity as concurrent agriculture secretary.

The second scandal is about the purchase of overpriced, outdated laptops for teachers by the Department of Education (DepEd) during the past administration.

Both controversies are seen as a litmus test for the new administration’s effort to eliminate graft and corruption, an evil that has plagued the government since time immemorial.

Both scandals involved huge amounts of money, and public suspicion is that some government officials have received and/or will receive millions of pesos in bribes.

In the sugar import controversy, Malacanang Palace vowed that “heads will roll.”

But Agriculture Undersecretary Leocadio Sebastian, who signed the questionable SRA sugar import resolution, jammed the gun on Malacanang by resigning immediately.

Nevertheless, he should not be let off the hook. The government should prosecute him and the other officials involved and see to it that they end up behind bars.

This would demonstrate that the government is dead serious in its fight against graft and corruption.

The purchase of overpriced and outdated laptops appears to be a more serious case because it involved P2.4 billion, a huge amount. It was alleged that the computers were overpriced by at least P20,000 each.

The purchase took place when Leonor Briones was the education secretary. It was claimed she had been hiding due to the Senate investigation on the matter.

Briones dismissed the claims, saying that the purchase of thousands of computers was done through the Procurement Service-Department of Budget and Management (PS-DBM).

Responding to questions by members of the Senate Blue Ribbon Committee chaired by Senator Francis Tolentino, she said that the DepEd asked the PSDBM to procure the laptops for them because the latter specializes in “big-time” procurements.

She stressed that while the DepEd has six Bids and Awards Committees (BAC), the P2.4 billion worth of procurement needed a huge BAC.

Briones insisted that what the DepEd, under her watch, did was legal and had been done by other government agencies for the past decades.

The actions on these cases will tell us how determined the administration is in its campaign against graft and corruption. If it takes decisive and forceful actions and imposes maximum penalty on the people involved, it would mean the Marcos administration has zero tolerance for corrupt officials and employees. The cost of leaving a stone unturned: the DepEd laptop scandal

Errant ex-DepEd secretary and ex-doyenne of education Madam Liling Briones and some of her alter egos are at it again two months after stepping down!

Laoag City gov't mull over tricycle fare; drivers push for P9 fare hike

LAOAG CITY (PIA) – Officials of the City Government of Laoag, together with the presidents of the Tricycle Operators and Drivers' Association (TODA) of the city, convened on Tuesday to discuss their petition for a P9.00 fare increase from the P11.00 basic fare.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic community quarantines, the regular tricycle fare increased from P11.00 to P20.00 and the fare for students, senior citizens, and people with disabilities increased

from P9 to P15. With the community quarantines being lifted and students returning to face-to-face classes, there have been complaints from both students and parents to return the original tricycle fare which is P11.00, under the 2011 city ordinance.

"The tricycle drivers and operators are contending that the original fare guide is no longer applicable because of high price of basic commodities particularly gasoline," said City Mayor Michael Marcos

Keon said. The TODA presidents are proposing for the regular tricycle fare to be P20 and the students fare to be P15, the same rate as when community quarantines were implemented to subsidize the drivers to keep up with the increasing prices of gasoline at other motor parts. Laoag City chair of the Committee of Transportation, John Michael Fariñas urged the tricycle drivers to implement the P11 fare as they mull over their petition.

Vice Mayor Rey Carlos Fariñas said that the Sangguniang Panlungsod will immediately tackle the matter and resolve it through a resolution.

To further ease the burden of the tricycle operators and drivers, Keon is seeking the help of Ilocos Norte Governor Matthew Marcos Manotoc to give financial assistance through fuel subsidy amounting to P4,000 to be given to all the tricycle drivers in Laoag City. In Pangasinan, the last leg of the series of provincial distribution of GPP was held on August 19, 2022, at the DA-Pangasinan Research & Experiment Center (PREC), Sta. Barbara town.

Before the distribution of the vegetable seeds and garden tools, the DA-RFO I conducted a technical briefing to help the recipients have a better understanding of how they can fully utilize the production inputs and tools that they have received to make the project more sustainable.

"The GPP is a continuing project until we cover all the public schools in the region," said Bongais.

The GPP, which is under the HVCDP, is financed by the Plant Plant Program, one of the proactive measures of the national government to mitigate the effects of the global economic challenges brought about by the Covid-19 pandemic and the Russia-Ukraine crisis.

She said the GPP is a joint undertaking nationwide between the DA and the Department

of Education (DepEd) to address malnutrition among school children by promoting the production of nutritious and safe foods.

The program will serve as a laboratory for students to know and apply their knowledge on vegetable production and showcase small-scale food production models. It will also inculcate among the students the values of gardening, wellness, and care for the environment.

Participating schools will establish school gardens as ready food baskets or sources of vegetables for the schools' feeding program, especially for malnourished schoolchildren.

The DA will spearhead the implementation of the program and provide the production inputs such as seeds, organic fertilizers, and garden tools and facilitate the conduct of training.

DSWD educational aid – timely, beneficial amid pandemic

The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), through its Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation program, recently started providing educational assistance to students-in-crisis in the country.

According to the DSWD, a student-in-crisis is either of the following: breadwinner; working student; orphan/abandoned and living with relatives; child of a single parent; child whose parents are unemployed especially when either of them is a person with disability or with a severe disease or a parent with human immunodeficiency virus or HIV; child of a distressed overseas Filipino worker; victim of child abuse; and victim of calamity or disaster.

In Ilocos Sur, more than 2,000 students have received their educational assistance as of August 27.

Amid the challenges posed by the Covid-19 pandemic, residents of Ilocos Sur say the assistance is timely and beneficial as

classes in elementary and secondary schools have started.

Remedios Acosta, resident of Vigan City and a mother of two children, thanked the DSWD for the educational assistance saying that it will be helpful for her son's education now that in-person classes are again implemented.

"Isa sa mga anak ko, Grade 12 siya ngayon, ang nakakuha ng P3,000 educational assistance. Gagamitin namin ito pambili ng uniporme niya para sa kanyang pag-aaral at pandagdag allowance na rin," she said in an interview during the payout held on August 27 in Vigan City.

She is unemployed while her husband is a construction worker.

While her first-born, a college student, was not qualified to the assistance as she's already a scholar of the provincial government, Acosta understands and wished for the continuity of the government's program.

DOST gives funding support to MSMEs in La Union

SAN FERNANDO CITY (PIA) – The Department of Science and Technology (DOST)-Region 1, through its Provincial Science and Technology Center, awarded a total of P3.89 million funding support to seven small business firms in La Union under the Small Enterprise Technology Upgrading Program (SETUP).

Among the beneficiaries were three food firms, two furniture-making firms, and two businesses engaged in the metals and engineering sector.

On food production, the Kajonas Food Products in Bauang, La Union which produces palm oil received some P1.370 million worth of fund; the Mama Carmen's Meat Shop in Bangar town which makes pork longganisa got P275,600; and the Lomboy Farm, also located in Bauang, which is into grape farming was granted with P480,000.

On the other hand, the RFG Wood Works in the municipality of Luna which is a furniture-making firm was awarded

with P265,000 fund and the Villanueva Furniture Shop of Bacnotan town with P250,000.
