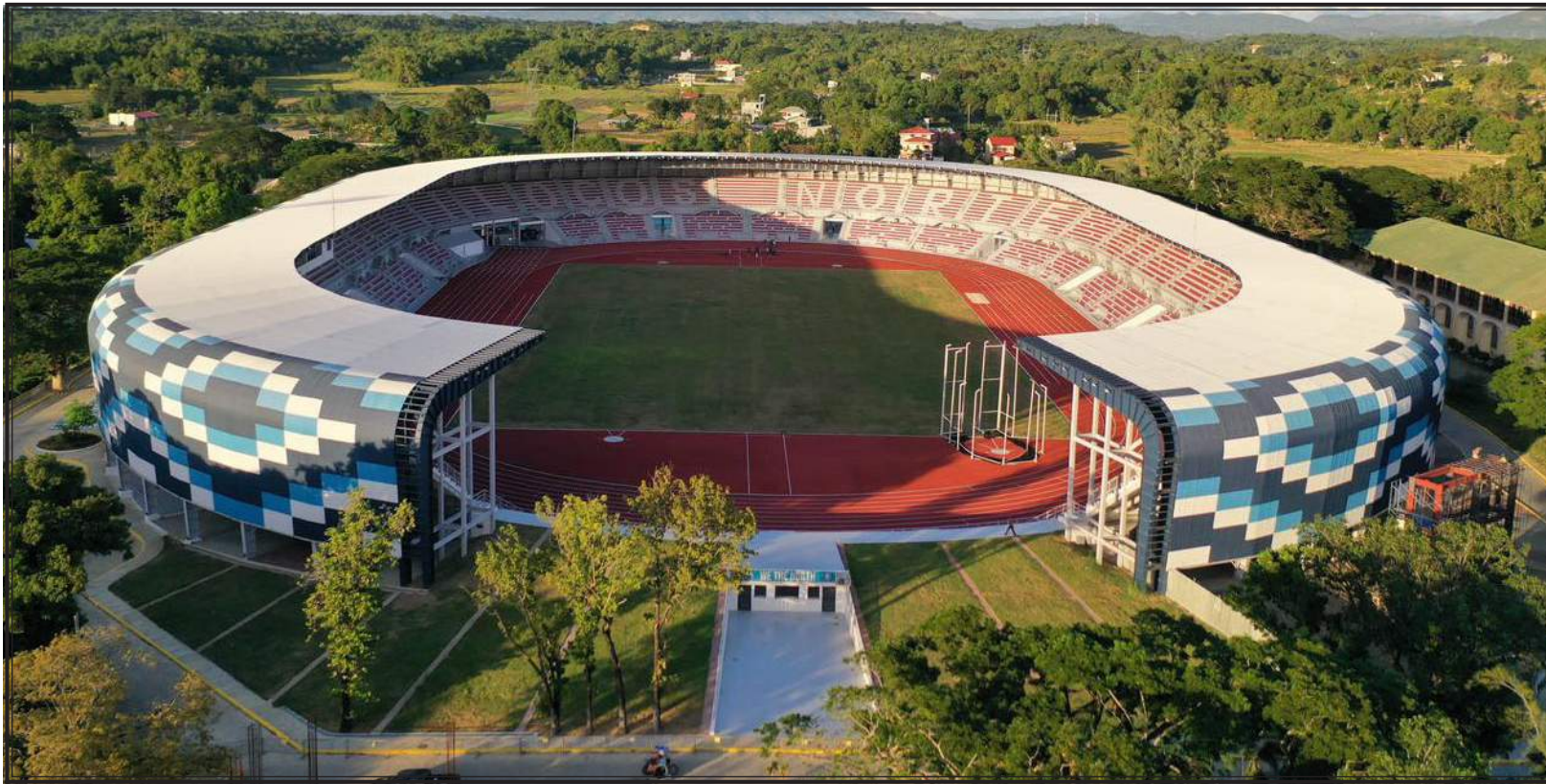

# P6.75 per KWH: A boon to all INEC consumers

• *The rate is fixed even if the coal price in the market gets higher under the one-year deal--GNPD*

**LAOAG CITY (PIA) –** The Ilocos Norte Electric Cooperative (INEC) has entered into a one-year Emergency Power Supply Agreement with GNPowder Dinginin (GNPD) Ltd. Co to ensure a power supply of up to 51 megawatts for the province.

The agreement was formally signed between INEC acting General Manager Cipriano “Perry” Martinez III and INEC board president Rex Vincent Rival as well as GNPD sales manager Ronald Gutierrez and GNPD power marketing officer

Florence Aguilar.

The signing was held at the INEC’s main office in Dingras, Ilocos Norte.

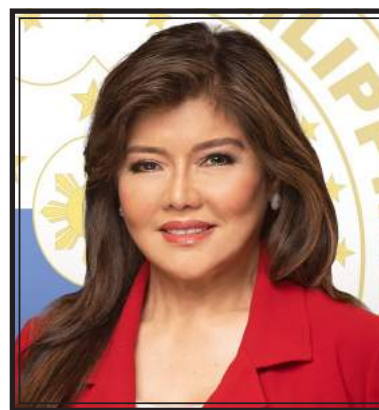

**PH, member states rally  
climate and health declaration at  
COP28 in Dubai, UAE**

Through the Department of Health (DOH), the Philippines joined 123 other member states in endorsing the Climate and Health Declaration in the Conference of Parties 28 (COP28) in Dubai, United Arab Emirates which supports the alignment of efforts on climate action, including measures that need to be put in place to bridge the gaps in progress.

COP28 is the United Nations' (UN) Annual Climate Change Conference and is considered "the world's only multilateral decision-making forum on climate change," which encourages the participation of almost every country in the world, specifically member states of the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC). The conference aims to discuss the crisis of climate change, such as global temperature rise, adaptation of vulnerable communities to climate change consequences, and achievement of zero-net emissions by 2050.

Health Secretary Teodoro J. Herbosa and other Department officials attended the conference joining over thousands of delegates from across the globe where the announcement of the Climate and Health Declaration during the Leader's Event: Putting Health at the Center of the Climate Agenda was featured. The member countries, including the Philippines, declared support amounting to US\$1 Billion to push the climate health agenda further globally.

"The Philippines, through the DOH, shall remain committed to pursuing the climate health agenda. We will be able to protect countless Filipino lives through comprehensive research endeavors to address data gaps, timely actions to address climate-related health impacts, utilization and adaptation of innovative efforts, and integrated health financing mechanisms," said Secretary Herbosa. **Straighten our  
crooked ways**

A soldier and his wife were preparing for the baptismal party of their baby girl when the chaplain arrived for the Baptism.

Taking the father aside, the priest asked, "Are you prepared spiritually for this religious event?"

"Well, I don't know, Father," said the soldier thoughtfully. "But would two bottles of whiskey and two cases of beer be enough?"

Those were different "spirits," of course. The chaplain was telling the soldier that the sacrament of Baptism is not just a drinking party but a religious occasion.

That applies also to the celebration of Christmas. While it is true that we celebrate the birth of the Lord with festivities and merry making, we should remember that Christmas is, first and foremost, a religious event.

The trouble is that our modern society has commercialized Christmas so much that we have mistaken

the icing from the cake and the accident from the substance.

John the Baptist in this second Sunday gospel, exhorts us: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." He is not referring to road repairs although that's a reminder for our Department of Public Works and Highways to fix our rough and potholed roads!

The prophets, Isaiah and John the Baptist, are conveying in Jewish metaphor the message that our morally crooked ways must be eradicated, the rough edges of our character be made smooth and warped attitudes straightened.

Why must we "straighten our crooked ways"? Gunar Myrdal, renowned author of the voluminous book Asian Drama, says that one major drawback to economic progress of nations is attributed to their negativistic traits and values. Where there are corrupt practices, political disunity, greed, economic

## DOH turns over funds, BHS packages and dental equipment to two provinces in Ilocos Region

Two provinces in Ilocos Region namely, Ilocos Norte and Ilocos Sur, received Barangay Health Station (BHS) packages, set of dental chairs and instruments and fund allocations for district hospitals from the Department of Health (DOH) – Ilocos Region during a separate turn-over ceremony held at the Batac Museum Ilocos Norte and at the Ilocos Sur Provincial Farmers Livelihood Center in Vigan City last Saturday, December 2, 2023.

For Ilocos Norte, a total of twenty-four (24) set of BHS packages worth P500k were distributed to the health facilities of the 2nd District including 11 sets to the local government (LGU) of Solsona, 11 to Pinili LGU, 1 for the City of Batac, and 1 for Nueva Era.

The BHS package is composed of a dressing cart, minor surgical set, mechanical bed, spine board, EENT diagnostic set, weighing scale with BMI calculator, weighing scale for infant, fetal doppler and examining table, medicine cabinet, instrument cabinet, nursing kit, tabletop sterilizer, and generating set 10kva funded through the Health Facility Enhancement Program (HFEP).

For Ilocos Sur, a complete set of eight (8) dental chairs worth P168,000 were given to the district hospitals of Magsingal and Gabriela Silang and six (6) other rural health units in the province including eleven (11) sets of dental instruments worth P22,000 for the prevention and control of dental diseases and

promotion of dental health in the communities.

Regional Director Paula Paz M. Sydiongco, who personally handed the donations said that the medical equipment was funded under the General Appropriations Act of 2023.

“Primary healthcare facilities are at the forefront of providing vital health services directly to our communities such as vaccinations, basic check-ups including health education programs and these equipment will help improve the delivery of basic health care services, especially in remote barangays where healthcare access is limited.

Sydiongco also turned over 20% (first tranche) of project allocation funds from HFEP for the construction/ completion/upgrading/ repair of Ilocos Sur District

Hospitals including P4M for Santa Lucia; P2,960,000 million for Cervantes; P4,366,000 for Salcedo; P5M to Tagudin; P2M Magsingal; P6,020,000 Narvacan; and P4M to Sinait.

The regional office also distributed HPV vaccines to the Ilocos Sur Provincial Office for the vaccination of 9-14 years old female children.

Sydiongco encouraged health officials to prioritize the HPV vaccination and ensure that the vaccines are distributed equitably and efficiently.

“Continue advocating for all Routine Vaccines and seek Zero-dose Children and provide them the needed immunization for their health and safety,” she emphasized. (Glen S. Ramos)

power consumers in the province,” said Martinez in a press briefing.

He said the INEC has a reinforced partnership with Aboitiz Power Corporation connected to the GNPD through its subsidiary, Therma Power Inc.

Under the signed deal, the power supply has a baseload capacity of 35 MW with a contracted price of P6.75 per kilowatt-hour.

INEC is entitled to a P0.10 discount if the bill is paid promptly.

Sources said GNPD is considered one of the

largest coal-fired power plants in the country.

“Fixed yung rate natin. Dati, kung tumataas ang presyo ng coal, tumataas din ang rate natin. Dahil fixed ang ating rate, kahit tumaas yung coal price sa market, P6.75 pa rin ang rate natin,” Gutierrez explained.

“Informal workers comprise 42 percent of the country's labor force, many of them farmhands, house helps, and gig workers in the creative industries,” she pointed out.

The senator added that the number could be higher if an accurate national inventory of informal workers was created.

Also known as the Violence and Harassment Convention of 2019, the ILO treaty “no longer refers to a territorial workplace but, more importantly, the entire world of work,” Marcos explained.

The treaty expanded the protection of workers beyond the traditional workplace and now includes places where workers take a meal or rest break, sanitary and changing facilities,

employer-provided accommodation, venues of work-related trips and social activities, as well as virtual spaces where work-related communications take place.

Besides informal workers, the treaty also protects trainees, interns, apprentices, volunteers, job applicants, and workers whose employment has been terminated.

Toward full compliance with the treaty, Marcos instructed the formation of two technical working groups to identify what domestic laws should be amended and to organize a reliable inventory of informal workers finally.

“Thirty-six countries have already ratified the treaty but the Philippines could be the first Asian country to do so,” Marcos said.
